#### COMING ATTRACTIONS 2018-19

#### On Target

Design & build and aircraft that takes off, flies, delivers a payload and lands. Your story will be about exploring a remote place.

#### **Medical Mystery**

Research medical conditions that can affect the human body. Present a story about a medical mystery that affects a human character. Create a representation of the mystery and at least one symptom. Present and action or scene that is shown from at least 2 perspectives at the same time.

#### Monster Effects

Design and build a structure that can support weight, which will be placed and removed. The sudden appearance of a monster enhanced by a special effect will have a surprising result.

#### Game On

Create a story that integrates research of a game. Your created game gizmo will cause an action or event to occur. There will also be a container that undergoes a transformation.

#### Heads Up

Research historical figures found on the heads of coins from around the world. Integrate an event into your skit and present it in 2 parts changing between tragedy and comedy and in 2 styles, verbal and nonverbal.

## **Escape Artists**

Identify, design and carry out a project that meets a real community need. Present a story about a character who attempts an escape. Use information about your project to provide clues to help the escape attempt.

## Pop Up - Rising Stars

Create and present a story that combines elements of both fiction and nonfiction. Build a technical device. Create an interactive, life-size pop-up book to help tell the story.

#### CHALLENGE SYNOPSES

#### **CHANGE OF TUNE**

Scientific concepts will be used to design and build an amusement park attraction. The team's story will have the attraction operating in an unlikely place.
